IMPORTED ADVENTURE

PATRICK MCGOOHAN, a ruggedly handsome chap, is leading the first British break into the American television series field. He is the star of CBS's *Secret Agent*, the only adventure and intrigue show now on Saturday night prime time.

Perhaps because the series is produced in England [at MGM studios] and wears the title of *Danger Man* when shown to European audiences, McGooohan inevitably is asked to compare his role with that of James Bond. Both roles are veddy British, you know, but there are differences.

"I don't carry weapons or have as many trick gadgets and cars as the Bond character," McGooohan says. "And I don't make quick, violent love with every pretty who comes along. Not that we lack beauties on our show, and that I don't appreciate them."

McGooohan is married to Joan Drummond, a former actress, and they have three daughters: Catherine, 12, Anne, 6, and Frances, 4. "Joan is my first wife and my last wife," McGooohan says. That, of course, is another difference between myself and James Bond."
